Chelsea is entering her second year as the women's assistant coach at Bellarmine University in Louisville, Kentucky. In 2018, Bellarmine posted an 11-6-3 record, advanced to the GLVC Tournament finals and had five players earned All-GLVC honors. In addition to helping the Bellarmine Knights, she works with the Kentucky Players Academy (KPA) during the winter seasons. KPA is high level program that is supplemental to the club soccer experience and helps develop, educate and expose players age 12-18 years old.

Prior to moving to Louisville, Chelsea was the women's assistant coach at Trinity University in San Antonio, Texas from 2015-2018, helping to lead the team to a 61-4-2 (.938) record over the past 3 seasons. Her work with the student athletes resulted in producing 5 All-Americans, 6 Academic All-Americans, 4 Scholar All-Americans, and 10 All-West Region honorees. During her three seasons as assistant coach, the team made 3 NCAA appearances and a total of 23 players earned All-SCAC honors.

Chelsea started her coaching career as the assistant women's coach at her alma mater, Wartburg College, in Waverly, Iowa from 2012-2014. During her playing career from 2008-2011, Chelsea was elected to the NSCAA All-North Region First Team in 2010 and 2011. She also was a four-time Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference honoree, played in 84 games for Wartburg, scoring 50 goals and 8 assists. Wartburg made two NCAA appearances during her time as a player, in 2010 and 2011.

Chelsea received her bachelor's degree in fitness management and psychology from Wartburg College in 2012 and also holds an NSCAA National Diploma. Chelsea resides in Louisville, Kentucky with her husband, Craig.
